Rocking Horse Preschool- RHPS is still accepting preschool students for the 3-year old class. Four-year-old class is full. Reviewed recruitment tools for the school. The State License is approved, and police background reports are complete and approved for another 3 years. Debbie Territ is stepping down as Board President at the end of the school year, June 2025. A new president is required for the upcoming 2025-2026 school year. The new president should be a member of the board.

Upcoming classroom activities include 4-year old conferences, a police officer visit, classroom observations by a member of the board and Easter Party.
