OLD BUSINESS:

A. Search for Partner congregation

Pastor Paul stated that prospective shared pastor candidate previously discussed is continuing to progress with potential interest from other church council. Meeting to be set up in April with Pastor and select members from each council to perform some discussion. Pastor Paul to discuss requirements with Pastor Asplin on necessary actions if prospect moves forward to official proceedings.

B. Removing inactive members

Draft Letter in progress. Sensitivity of sending letter was discussed by council. Pastor Paul noted that similar letter from Saint Matthias Lutheran Church was provided to help in drafting of letter.

C. Newsletter preferences

There was continued discussion from council on church members being unaware of the change. Following discussion, J. Luffy made a motion based on Pastor Paul's recommendation to send out a 1-page notification to all listed church members to clearly state the option to request receipt of the newsletter mailing with details on how to request receipt via phone or mail reply. Motion was seconded by D. Clawson. Motion was carried by All votes in favor, None opposed.

D. Constitution updates

Council reviewed letters from Jack Gesalman in regard to needing a constitution committee adhoc committee. Jack stated in letter that he was lead of an active Constitution committee, therefore no new committee was necessary. J. Luffy and A. Donahue also have joined committee. D. Clawson also volunteered to join committee. 1st meeting to be held in April.

It was also suggested that constitution committee reviews current committee list and discusses ability to eliminate and combine committees where possible.

E. Moving or replacing organ

Worship and Music committee is continuing to meet on options to move organ. Currently no plans to replace organ.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Clarify committee liaisons and chairpersons

List of committee liaisons in bulletin contains errors for Finance liaison as well as Property chairperson. It was already discovered and to be corrected on next bulletins. Note in Constitution update for potential review of committees.

B. Wedding for non-members

Pastor Paul brought to council a request to have a wedding ceremony at the church for non-members at their request. Church documents state that each request for a nonmember wedding is to be approved by church council. Details discussed: Pastor Paul noted that the marriage is recognized as granted by the church and provided by the residing pastor of the church. In this way, the council would also approve non-member marriages conducted by the serving pastor which would be performed away from Good Shepherd.

Consensus vote was obtained to commence the marriage of the stated non-members to be conducted in 2025. It was also suggested that we review and update the documentation due to its age. Amy volunteered to look into updating the pricing.




