

A Reflection for Easter on Matthew 28:1-10
Share the good news!

On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary saw light peeking over the horizon as they rushed to see the tomb where Jesus' body was laid. It was now the third day since Jesus was crucified, died, and was buried. They were among the many women who had followed Jesus from Galilee and provided for him during his ministry. They were witnesses to many healings and miracles and teachings by him. They had followed him to Jerusalem and stood by him through his crucifixion, looking on from afar. They witnessed Joseph of Arimathea bury Jesus and watched as a large stone sealed his tomb.

The women had little hope of getting close to the tomb or even getting inside. At the request of the chief priests and Pharisees, Pilate had ordered Roman soldiers to guard the tomb so no one could steal the body and tell people, "See, he has been raised from the dead just as he said." The women didn't carry with them the customary spices to anoint their beloved Jesus' body, for they knew getting past the guards and removing the large stone would be impossible for them. It was just another thing that added to their grief and sorrow. Still, they rushed to see the tomb to continue their vigil, unwavering in their love and faithfulness to Jesus even in death.

As the two women neared the tomb, suddenly all heaven broke loose. The quiet of the dawn was interrupted by the shuddering of the earth and by the descending of an angel from heaven. Before their astonished eyes, the angel rolled the great large stone away and calmly sat on it. The angel's display of power and the appearance of the dazzling white clothes pierced the darkness of their grief and sorrow. The two Marys looked at each other, remembering how the earth also shook at Jesus' death.

The angel, ignoring the Roman guards who had frozen in fear, turned to the women and said, "Do not be afraid. You are looking for Jesus. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay." I imagine that when they looked around the empty tomb, something inside the women broke loose and their hearts swelled in both fear and in joy. *Can it be? CAN IT BE!!!*

With astonishment and wonder, they heard the angel say, "Go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." Immediately, the women turned and ran from the angel and the empty tomb. They ran as fast as they could to share the good news of resurrection that had been handed over to them by God's emissary. *Jesus is Risen just as he said! He goes ahead of us to Galilee just as he promised! There we will see him just as he promised!* Hurrying along, the two Marys marveled that the inconceivable was somehow possible and plausible. Perhaps they recalled Jesus' words of promise during one of his teachings, "For God all things are possible."

Suddenly the unfathomable possibility of the God who did, does and will bring hope out of despair, light out of darkness, and life out of death met them on their way. Jesus, the light and life of the whole world, met them in their trembling fear and joy and said, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there

they will see me.” Their hearts burning inside, the two Marys knelt, took hold of Jesus’ feet, and worshipped him.

On Easter, God gathers us together in worship with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to hear the good news of the wonder, the mystery, the possibility, the power of God’s mercy and love in Jesus Christ to roll away the heavy stones in our hearts and to empty the tombs of our lives and to forth in us and among us — new life!

On Easter, God commissions us along with the two Marys to go and to share the good news that the crucified Jesus is Risen! To proclaim that the risen Jesus goes ahead to the places we carry out our daily lives – our jobs, our homes, our schools, our communities. As we go on our way, the risen Jesus will meet us, assuring us that God did, does, and will work healing and resurrection in our lives. In a funny text from a friend. In a thoughtful thank you card from a student. In a much-welcomed visit from a family member. In the sun breaking through a cloudy day. In the faces of faith communities like Good Shepherd and Salem who break bread together on our knees.

Easter is the day that the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad in it! For we, along with the two Marys, Peter and all the disciples of Jesus throughout all of history, can gather and hear, touch, taste, sing, and share in Jesus’ resurrection story – a great story of his unconditional and self-giving love written by God for us and for all people. May the blessings of the Risen Christ be with you all! Alleluia! — Pastor Kara

Report: Last Sunday School will be held on April 26th. Vacation Bible School will be held June 22-25 this year.

C. Community Fellowship

Report: Lunch with the Bunny will be held March 21 @12pm. Mad Hatter Tea Party April 25 @1:00pm. Community Yard Sale June 13. VBS June 22-25. Christmas in July 18. Chicken BBQ Date TBD. Trunk Or Treat October 16. Light Up Night Dec 4th.

D. Personnel:

Report: A. Boy Scouts

Discussion: Kathy spoke with Boy Scout liaison Matt Fisher last Sunday and informed him that the scouts who met Wednesday, February 11th had ignored Rich's note and left food, etc. on the tables and had not cleaned up the floor. RHPS was having a Valentine's Day party with parents the next morning. The teachers had to mop and clean the tables. Scouts would not be meeting again until after Easter. Decision: Agreements between the scouts and the church should be updated with language regarding wiping down the tables and mopping the floor if needed. Follow-up: Kathy agreed to update the agreements with new language and have them signed. Should be signed annually anyway. Matt was to bring the issue up at a scout committee meeting on the Sunday that we talked.

B. Social Room Rental (nonmember) sexton

Discussion: After receiving a call regarding a possible wedding at the church Rachel pulled the Wedding Guidelines brochure to review. The committee discussed raising the fee for nonmembers renting the social room. Pastor Kara shared Salem's policies on weddings and funerals and suggested one agreement for community use. Pastor Kara also prepares her own wedding and funeral bulletins. This is a change for the Church Coordinator. Decision: Decision made to raise the non-member rate for social room rental as follows: \$250—\$50 to the sexton \$25 for the key (returned when key is returned) \$175 to Major Repairs Follow-up: Further review Good Shepherd policies for weddings and funerals and present rate increase to council.

C. Employee Contract Updates

Discussion: Extensively reviewed the new contracts for the Organists Ronna Yeager and Cara Remaley. The Finance Committee, Nancy Flinner and Pastor Kara have weighed in on the matter. Updated the contracts for the Church Coordinator and Sexton. Kathy, Rachel and Pastor Kara discussed aligning the contracts more with Salem's staff regarding holidays and leave given at the pastor's discretion. Decision: Present draft contracts to both Ronna and Cara for their questions/feedback. Organist contracts to begin effective April 5, 2026. Follow-up: Present draft contracts to both Ronna and Cara for their feedback/questions. Present four (4) contracts to church council for approval at the March meeting.

D. Upcoming Events

Discussion: Everyone made aware of upcoming Lenten services at Good Shepherd and Salem. Attention paid to which organist is playing at which service. Discussion: Discussed raising the amount for social room rental to

give \$25 more to the Sexton. Kathy to research current agreement language to see what cleanup responsibilities are listed. No motion at this time.

Business Items

Old Business

A. Looking for Grant Writers for church maintenance projects.

Discussion: Scott Electric's website includes information on their Foundation and the monies they gave last year. At least one recipient was a church. It includes a two-page application. Decision: To pursue inquiry to Scott Electric and the church in Trauger that got grant money to replace their stained glass windows. Follow-up: Property Committee to get more information from Scott Electric. Kathy to get more information on the window grant. Due Date: 04/20/2026 06:30 PM

B. Scouts/Clean Up after meetings

Discussion: See Personnel Committee report. Need to remind all, including the scouts, to lock the doors if they are the last ones out. Also, a parishioner provided and hung a new flag but it is considered undersized. Scouts were going to provide a new flag and dispose of the old one properly. Now flying at half-mast. Decision: Scouts can provide flag of appropriate size and dispose of old flag properly. Follow-up: None required.

C. Payroll Direct Deposit

Discussion: Brian spoke to the Treasurer. Has not been to the bank yet. Parochial report not yet submitted. Electronic transfer of Pastor's pay spelled out in the Parish Agreement. Decision: Payroll direct deposit should be explored and the electronic transfer of Pastor Kara's pay should be set up. Parochial report to be submitted. Follow-up: Treasurer/Finance Committee to explore direct deposit of employee pay, electronic transfer of Pastor's pay. Parochial report to be submitted. Due Date: 04/20/2026 06:30 PM

D. Church Organist Hiring/Contracts

Discussion: Needed new contracts for Ronna Yeager and Cara Remaley as Organist and Pianist/Flautist respectively. Also updated contracts for the Church Coordinator and Sexton to include holidays. Decision: Ronna to play the first, third and fifth (if appropriate) Sundays and Cara to play the second and fourth Sundays. To be paid \$184 per service less withholding. Contracts for the Church Coordinator and the Sexton to be updated to include holidays. Follow-up: Contracts to be signed by all appropriate parties with an effective date of April 5, 2026. Due Date: 04/05/2026 12:00 AM

Motions:

- To accept the contracts as written for the organists, Cara Remaley and Ronna Yeager, for the trial period from 4/5/26 to 12/31/26 at \$184 per service less withholding. Result: Passed (Unanimous)
- To accept the updated contracts for the Church Coordinator/ Youth Programs Director and Sexton with changes to the holidays and time off given at the Pastor's discretion. Result: Passed (Unanimous)

New Business

A. Rally Day recommendation from Parish Council

Discussion: The Parish agreement directs that Salem and Good Shepherd rally together at a combined event. Since Good Shepherd already has a pavilion reserved at Mt. Odin for an August 23rd picnic, this could be the joint event. Decision: Salem and Good Shepherd will gather together for a joint picnic to be held at the Lund Pavilion at Mt. Odin on Sunday, August 23rd. The event will include a worship service to start. Free tickets to be distributed for a door prize. Jack would like members of Salem to be involved with picnic planning (games, activities, etc.). Meeting dates to be determined. Follow-up: Schedule planning meeting(s) for

B. Approval for Community Fellowship to host a Spaghetti dinner & Basket Raffle in June. ALL proceeds will benefit the West Point Fire Department.

Discussion: The West Point Fire Department could benefit from a fund raiser. They work closely with Food Shepherd on our events, especially Light Up Night. Decision: Good Shepherd will host a spaghetti dinner with the proceeds going to West Point Fire Department. Follow-up: Date of the spaghetti dinner to be determined in collaboration with the Fire Department.

Motions:

- To allow the Community Fellowship Committee to host a spaghetti dinner with ALL proceeds going to benefit the + West Point Fire Department.

Result: Passed (Unanimous)

C. Parish Council Minutes

Discussion: Parish Council met on Monday, February 23rd at Good Shepherd. Cathy Piper (Salem) was elected Chairperson and Linda Turchetta (Good Shepherd) was elected Secretary. Linda provided the meeting minutes for council to review. Parish Council reviewed each paragraph of the agreement. Decision: Joint Picnic already scheduled. Parish name needed. Need to set up electronic transfer of Pastor Kara's pay. Follow-up: Need to name the joint parish. Suggested having a contest to come up with a name to be voted on. Next Parish Council meeting scheduled for May 26, 2026. Need to set up electronic transfer of Pastor Kara's pay. No deadline set for either.

D. (Added During Meeting)

Discussion: Linda Turchetta inquired as to whether she was to continue as Chair of the Audit Subcommittee. Bill Benton conducting audit of 2025 envelopes Decision: Council determined that Linda should continue as auditor for 2026. Follow-up: None required.

E. (Added During Meeting)

Discussion: Amy stated that a parishioner asked about a plaque to honor Nancy Maxson. Unclear if the family is paying for this nearly a year after her death. Concern voiced about too many plaques throughout the church. Would entertain other ideas for memorial. Decision: Tabled until Amy talks again to the parishioner to get more information. Follow-up: Amy to get more information on this. No deadline established.

Miscellaneous Business

A. Video of the Sunday Service

Discussion: Denny stated that some parishioners are not able to view the service because they don't have Facebook. Inquired about YouTube instead. Discussed difference between live and recorded and that the does not have a license for Facebook. Zion and First Lutheran both have licenses at a cost of maybe \$300-400 annually. Decision: No resolution to this discussion.

B. Increase of ushers, counters & readers for Sunday Services

Discussion: Would be nice to have ushers, counters and readers sign up in advance for services. Help needed for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter. Decision: Encourage fellow parishioners to participate in ushering, reading and counting. Maybe council members could take a month to usher for example. Follow-up: See above. Need more help on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter.

C. Property Communication

Discussion: Good Shepherd is grateful for its volunteers, especially those who help on property. It is not always made known to the office when individuals are doing work at the church. Denny added that parts were found to repair the air/ heating units found in the sanctuary. Will not have to buy new units. No current chair of the Property Committee leads to some of the communication problems. Decision: When anyone is doing work at the church the office should be notified. Follow-up: Notify the office of any work being done at the church. Fix the air/heating units in the sanctuary. Encourage someone to volunteer to be the chair of the Property Committee. No deadline established.

D. (Added During Meeting)

Discussion: Jack suggested that the Call Committee be dissolved as is no longer needed. Decision: Council agreed to dissolve the Call Committee with a thank you to those who volunteered. Follow-up: Rachel to put blurb in the bulletin and newsletter to state that the Call Committee was being dissolved along with a thank you to those who volunteered.

Motions:

- To dissolve the Call Committee and thank those who volunteered. Result: Passed (Unanimous)



In 2012, Reagan's family decided to start a free pediatric closet where families, caregivers, agencies, and hospitals could help the children they serve get medical equipment they desperately needed without waiting upwards of 6 months navigating through insurance denials and appointment wait times. Custom equipment is best, but no child should have to wait and insurance will only cover 1 piece of equipment every 3-5 years. This is a hardship for families when children experience growth spurts and developmental changes. Reagan's Journey accepts gently used pediatric durable medical equipment and unused medical supplies. The items are sanitized and redistributed to children in need. Anyone in PA, surrounding states and even Canada, who is caring for a child with special needs and is willing to make the trip can schedule an appointment to have access to the items. On average they serve 500 families per year by giving them the supplies they need for their kids - for FREE!
