

Several years ago, I took a sabbatical. The question that prompted me towards this sabbatical was: *I wonder if God ever got tired or gets tired from all of God's work?* Scripture would respond: *Yes.*

In the gospels, we read about Jesus often retiring to quiet places in order to pray, rejuvenate and rest from all his work of teaching, preaching, healing, blessing and feeding people. In Genesis, we find that in the beginning God rested after the work of creation:

1 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished and all their multitude. 2 On the sixth day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. 3 So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation. (Gen. 2:1-2)

What a great teaching from scripture for us! *God rested!* God built rest/sabbath into creation itself as a natural part of health, vitality and life. Jesus embodied this in his earthly, human life, again revealing to us and for us that rest is *holy, good and necessary.*

Sabbath rest is a gift to us, a word of grace built into life by God. Too often we overlook, dismiss or squander this gift of grace. Somehow coming to believe instead that all our value, life, health and vitality is rooted in endless producing, doing, consuming, staying busy.

But this is not so. God knows we need sabbath. So my mission challenge to you this summer is: Rest dear people of God. Rest

when you need it. Don't feel guilty. Don't be pressured by messages that tell you to get busier.

Take a sabbath when you need it. This may take a different form for different people, but what is common is like Jesus — finding quiet moments, times and places to pray, rejuvenate and rest from all your work and to give thanks to God for essentially teaching us in scripture— It's ok to take a break from all the work.

I pray you have blessed times of rest and rejuvenation this summer!

First Trimester Financial Report

Income

A summary of our financial wellbeing as of the beginning of May: we are in fair shape. Compared to last year, envelope income is slightly higher. At this time last year our income from envelopes was \$63,939, this year it is \$67,564, an increase of \$3625. However one giving unit who usually gave a large donation at the

end of year has given early which inflated this number so the increase is only \$625. Of the 75 other giving units that contributed so far this year, 44 units have given more than last year, 19 have given less, and 12 gave the same. There are 11 units who contributed last year during the first trimester that have not contributed so far this year. Of these one has died, two have transferred and the other eight have not contributed for various reasons.

To compare with budgeted income, the first trimester budgeted amount is \$49,566, which makes it appear like we are significantly ahead of budget but it includes four contributions that is their donation for the year. If these contributions are distributed into the trimesters we are only \$1998 ahead of the budget with summer coming.

Expenditures

We have spent more on snow removal than budgeted and more on gas than what we anticipated. We need a warm November and December. The repair of the auxiliary heat/cooling unit cost over \$2000 of unbudgeted expenses (it will be taken out of Major Repair escrow account for now). Card tables were purchased but paid for by contributions. Some major anticipated expenses include sealing and painting the main parking lot, replacing lighting in the social room (We are applying for a grant to cover material but labor will not be covered), and repointing the bricks on outside of church near the rock garden at entrance. Donations to these projects can be made to major repair. Remember however we need regular give to meet budget expenses and save tapping our operating escrow to make budget.

Started in 2012, reagan's journey is a free pediatric closet where families, caregivers, agencies, and hospitals can help children get medical equipment they desperately needed without waiting upwards of 6 months navigating through insurance denials and appointment wait times. Custom equipment is best, but no child should have to wait and insurance will only cover 1 piece of equipment every 3-5 years and as we know children are constantly growing! Reagan's Journey accepts gently used pediatric durable medical equipment and unused medical supplies. The

items are sanitized and redistributed to children in need. If you or someone you know would like to donate gently used pediatric medical equipment, please contact them to see if they are able to accept it at this time and to arrange a drop off appointment. Their phone number is 724-826-0778, their email address is info@reagansjourney.org and their website is reagansjourney.org. Anyone who is caring for a child with special needs and is willing to make the trip can schedule an appointment to have access to pick out items they are in need of. On average, they serve 500 families per year by giving them the supplies they need for their kids - for FREE! We are asked to help with monetary donations, their greatest need. It costs \$150 per family to operate the Reagan's Journey Closet. Financial support keeps the pediatric medical equipment closet FREE to families who need it.

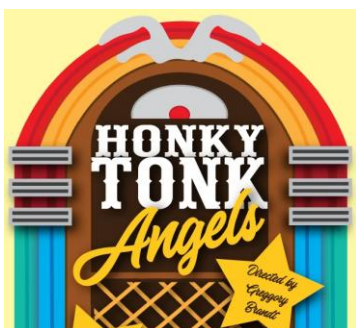

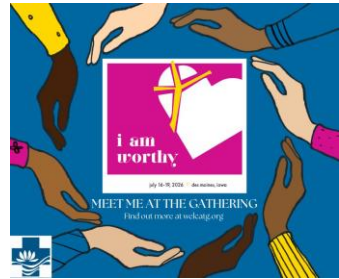
