COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. Youth—Youth packed the Food 2 Go bags on October 1st. The Youth Pie Fundraiser sold 140 items. Pies will be available for pickup on October 21st and 22nd. Youth will be participating in and leading the Veteran's Day service on Sunday, November 12th.
- B. Property—Bulbs were replaced in light fixture by the red door in the Christian Ed wing. Light still not working so will try replacement of the ballast next. Planning to replace current light switches with paddle switches as they are easier to operate. Electrician was called to set up walkthrough. Family bathroom sink appears to be loose. Will look into fixing or replacing. New signs for front bathroom now displayed to be more clear for people of all ages.
- C. Community Fellowship—Murder Mystery Dinner had 54 tickets sold. Next event will be Trunk or Treat on October 22nd from 1 to 3 pm. Light Up West Point/Wendover will be held Friday, December 1st from 5 to 8 pm. Next planning meeting for Light Up Night to be held on October 23rd at 7 pm. Annual Chili Cook-off to be postponed until January 6th.
- D. Rocking Horse Preschool—Director of RHPS to contact the State of PA to understand upcoming training and determine if it is offered via Zoom. The new RHPS sink is scheduled for delivery on November 9th and for installation on November 10th.
- E. Christian Education—Sunday Club kids to sing during the Christmas Concert scheduled for Sunday, December 17th. There will be no children's program following the Advent dinner this year.

- F. Worship and Music Committee met on Monday, October 2, 2023.
- 1. The Reformation Sunday Service will be a German Mass format. We used that format several years ago for that service. This will be on October 29th.
- 2. A Healing Service will be held on Thursday, November 9th at 7 pm. Pastor Sheehan will lead the service.
- 3. The Advent Dinner will be held on Sunday, December 3rd at 5 pm. Ham will be provided. Those who attend are encouraged to bring a side dish.
- 4. The Christmas Concert will be held on Sunday, December 17th at 10:30. Selections will be provided by the choir, bell choir and there will be some special music arrangements.
- 5. A Blue Christmas Service will be held on Thursday, December 21st at 7 pm with Matt Fisher and Bettie leading the service.
- 6. Christmas Eve falls on Sunday, December 24th. A Simple Service with no choir will be held at 10:30 am. Christmas Eve services will be held at 4:30 and 7:30 pm. There will be a Saturday evening service on December 23rd at 5:30.
- G. Finance Committee submitted a report concerning our Financial State. This includes the number of contributing units and an accounting of monies in escrow accounts, usable assets, gifts and endowments, benevolent assets, designated assets and additional funds to meet the needs of the pastor with regard to housing, continuing education, etc. The report indicates that we cannot afford a full-time pastor, but instead a part-time or shared pastor.

CALLING A PASTOR

Pastor Peter Asplin, representing the Synod, addressed the council regarding the process needed to call a new pastor. Before the Call Committee can meet, the congregation and church council need to decide if the church is going to pursue calling a part-time pastor or a shared pastor. Pastor Asplin explained the differences between the two, including the time commitment, the pros and cons of each, and the salary requirements. The ELCA is in full communion partnership with other denominations including the Presbyterian Church (PCUSA), the Reformed Church in America, The United Church of Christ, the Episcopal church, the Moravian Church and the United Methodist Church so a pastor could be shared with these various churches. He suggested having four "cottage meetings" with small

groups of the Good Shepherd congregation to answer questions and determine what the congregation would like to see happen. The process can also be explained in temple talks over a four-week period leading up to the cottage meetings. Pastor Asplin also recommended that the church council address the need for establishing policy regarding both Family and Sabbatical Leave.

OLD BUSINESS

- A. The four council members who are eligible to run in January were asked their intentions. Jessica Darragh and Bonnie Altman will be running again while Denny Clawson has decided that he can be of service in other ways and will not re-run. Andy King is "on the fence" and has not yet decided. Joy Stynchula will be filling an open spot until the end of this year and has decided to run again in January.
- B. Meeting between Jessica Darragh, Debbie Territ and Dorothy Gesalman regarding kitchen storage and upkeep went well. Bonnie suggested that Personnel and W/ELCA meet again before the end of the year.
- C. Jenny asked if we could do something for the neighbor's children as they just lost their father. Talked about doing a Christmas basket for the kids. Jessica to get involved as a member of the Evangelism Committee.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. With the absence of Stewardship, the Finance Secretary is asking for permission to run a pledge drive. Council took a look at the pledge "card" already prepared and decided it should be re-worded. Andrew agreed to re-write to ask people to consider their blessings and what God has given us. Harry Harbaugh volunteered to do a Temple Talk this coming Saturday.
- B. Newsletter restructure—Council decided that the council meeting minutes should continue to be printed in the newsletter in a condensed form, that it was Rachel's discretion to shorten articles submitted for the newsletter and that people should be surveyed as to how they want to receive their newsletter—pick up at the church, read it online or continue to receive it in the mail.
- C. Approval of council members for the remainder of the year. Motion made to nominate Joy Stynchula and Dee Salentino to fill the two council openings until the end of this year.
 - D. Motion made to name the current shed in honor of Bill

Ambrose and Jack Rutter in recognition of their longtime service to Good Shepherd.

- E. Advent money to be sent to Lutheran World Relief.
- F. Giving envelopes—discussed the large number of envelope boxes never picked up by members this year. Envelopes for 2024 have already been ordered but council determined that Rachel and the Finance Committee should go through the list and look at the giving history. Envelopes will then have to be renumbered.




