



Dear Good Shepherd,

As I write, I am mindful that the season of Advent is almost upon us. The core of





Another way we speak of his coming is by the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives now. Even as we wait with patience and hope for the coming of the Lord, we also rejoice at his presence among us now. Throughout Advent, on Sunday mornings, we give thanks and praise for Jesus our Emmanuel, God with us. We celebrate what we already have: Jesus present with and for us: in

word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. Throughout Advent, we pray that God open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us now.

This truth and grace of Christ is so important to hold onto. The expectation of Christ coming again to usher is universal peace and the reality of Christ with us now, strengthening our faith in the promises of God. Why is this important? Because you are embarking on a big change in the congregation's life. On November 30, you will enter into a new yoked ministry with Salem Lutheran Church in Delmont. This means sharing with another congregation of God's people the Pastor's time and compensation. This means changing Sunday worship time for Salem to 8:30AM and Good Shepherd to 11AM. This means sharing in the work of the gospel. This means keeping each other in prayer. This means living in harmony with one another.

I know that such change can be jarring. We all may be anxious. But I also hope that we are open to what God is doing new with his people at Good Shepherd and Salem. I hope as we grow into a yoked ministry, we remember Jesus' words when he says, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." [Matt. 11:29-30]

What will be most helpful as we move into a new future together is to remember:

One, Jesus is with us, and that we do not bear the changes and the work of the gospel alone. First and foremost, we are yoked with Jesus. Jesus is our primary ministry partner. His way of living by forgiveness and love, justice and peace, faith and hope is an easy yoke to bear because we are yoked to him, now and always!

Two, a rule of thumb I learned early in life is "more hands make light work." Salem and Good Shepherd can be a blessing to

each other. Not merely for financial means of support, but sharing in the yoke of ministry. More youth and adults yoked: working together, learning together, worshipping together, praying together. It's important to remember that while each congregation will retain its own identity and ministries specific to their contexts, we also will have one another for mutual support.

As the Pastor of this new yoked ministry, I am hopeful. I am hopeful that sharing the financial compensation package will alleviate some anxiety about each congregation's sustainability. Even more, I am hopeful that Salem and Good Shepherd will find in each other a faithful and helpful ministry partner. I am hopeful that for activities and events at Good Shepherd, I will see Salem people showing up for you! I am hopeful that for activities and events at Salem, I will see Good Shepherd people showing up for them!

And I am grateful. I give thanks to God for the many ministries at both Good Shepherd and Salem through which we can see the the redeeming love of Christ being shown to one another and others. I give thanks to God for your willingness and courage to walk in the light of the Lord as God is doing a new thing within and among us!

As we enter a new season of Advent and a new season of life in the gospel together, I offer you this pray from *ELW Vespers* [p.317]: O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us go forth in peace. For Christ is with us. Thanks be to God! — The Reverend Kara J. Propst

Not everyone experiences the Christmas season as a joyful time. For some people, the holiday season can be difficult and generate feelings of loneliness, sadness, or loss. This can be for a variety of reasons: the death of loved ones, separation or divorce, trying to find employment, feelings of melancholy or depression. Whatever the reason, the holiday season can be for many people a time of isolation and/or sadness. At the same time, the nights are getting longer with the longest night of the year on December 21.

The Blue Christmas/Longest Night service is a modern service designed for anyone who is stressed, lonely, or grieving. Everyone is welcome: Lutheran, Christian, non-Christian. The simple worship service of readings, song, and a brief reflection is designed to validate what we are feeling, and help us sense God's presence in the midst of what can be a difficult time.

All are welcome to come. Please share with anyone you think would be interested in this service.
