Call to order; 6:30 pm by Brian Gesalman, Chair.

Accept Agenda; Motion to accept agenda by Jenny Luffy, seconded and approved.

Communications; Brian Gesalman reported that the UPG Car Club was interested on using our parking lot for their meetings/ gatherings. Brian discussed the rules with the group and has not heard back from them as of yet.

Officer Reports;

Pastor Gruesu reported on visitations to members and meetings.

The following are corrections to the September minutes. Good Shepherd Council currently has Four positions open for 2026. The motion to accept the agenda, the minutes and the treasurer report was Jim Stewart. The motion to close the meeting was Jack Gesalman.

Jack Gesalman motioned to accept September minutes with corrections, seconded and approved.

Motion to accept Treasurer/ Finance reports by Greg Bittner, seconded and approved.

Committee Reports;

- **A. Youth.** The Youth went to Evergreen Drive on Friday, October 3rd for Trunk or Treat and to watch the movie Casper.
- **B. Rocking Horse Preschool.** The budget for the 2025-2026 school year was presented to the Board and approved. All tuition payments were received for the month of September. Enrollment for the school year is (6) 3-year olds and (14) 4-year olds. RHPS Bylaws are in the process of being revised. Teacher contracts are signed and waiting for Council approval. Website updates are in progress and new director paperwork has been sent to the State and waiting

for acceptance. RHPS is reviewing ideas to celebrate the 50th Anniversary during the 2026-2027 school year. West Point Fire Department is scheduled for a visit in October during Fire Prevention month. Pictures are scheduled for October 15th and 16th. The next meeting is Wednesday, October 15, 11;45 am.

C. Community Fellowship. Stooges Night was a fun evening. Huge thanks to our presenter Rich Sanner. Trunk or Treat will be held Friday, October 17th 6:30- 8:30pm. Adult Turkey Wreath Craft night Sunday, November 2nd 1:00. The cost is \$15.00. Spots are still available. The Fourth annual Light up Night is Friday, December 5th 6:00-8:30pm Volunteers needed! There a sign-up sheet posted in the commons area of the church. It was brought to Council the importance of volunteers needed for Community events. This involves set up, manning, and cleanup. These events are enjoyed by many families some with young children throughout Westmoreland County. Come out and have fun while being a Volunteer!!!!

D Finance. Jack Gesalman Has started asking the Church Committees for their 2026 budget requests. These are due by November 11, 2025. Congregation Pledge cards will be available from October 25th to November 16, 2025.

Old Business:

- **A. Rocking Horse Preschool.** Linda Turchetta motioned for Council to accept the Bylaws as presented. The motion was seconded and approved.
- **B. Search for partner congregation**. A Parish Agreement draft was presented to the Council for review. There will be amendments to the initial agreement. Greg Bittner motioned for Council to accept the proposal as it will be amended. Council will also have a final vote on the Parish Agreement via e-mail. The motion was seconded and approved. Pastor Gruesu abstained from the Parish Agreement motion and future vote. The Parish Agreement will take affect November 30, 2025. This is pending approval of both councils.
- **C. Internal Audit.** Linda Turchetta and Barb Terek have been finalizing the audit. Linda is hoping to have this completed by the end of October.
- **D. Organist update.** Greg Bittner reported that he and Nancy Flinner had interviewed a candidate. Unfortunately, he withdrew his application. At present, we are still actively seeking an organist. We have 3 guest organists for November.
- **E. Council Roster.** There are four positions available to be on Council. Amy Donahue and Andrea Territ agreed to run again for their positions. Kathy

Wolfe is planning on running for a position on Council. If anyone is interested to be on Council, please contact Brian Gesalman.

New Business

A. Rocking Horse Preschool. RHPS has presented for approval a tree mural to celebrate their 50th anniversary.

The tree mural would be in the hallway. The branches would hold seasonal leaves and photographs of students and staff from the last 50 years. The Property Committee would be involved in approving the hallway paint color and oversee the mural project. Motion to accept the Mural by Linda Turchetta, seconded and approved.

- **B. Advent Funds.** The Advent Funds collected this year will be donated evenly to The West Point Fire Department and The Westmoreland Food Bank. Motion to accept by Jenny Luffy, seconded and approved.
- **C. Annual Reports.** The Committee reports are due back to Rachel King by December 15,2025. Rachel needs these reports to add to the Annual Report which will be presented at the January Congregational Meeting.

Adjournment; Motion to close by Andrea Territ, seconded and approved. Closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting Monday, November 17, 2025.

We are finalizing the Parish agreement to enter into an 18-month trial period for shared ministry and to become partners in our parish mission. Much will look the same as each church will maintain their individual councils and committees as well as their own budget and events. But I encourage everyone to look for opportunities to join in events at Salem Lutheran church as well and to welcome + members of Salem to join in at Good Shepherd events. Once approved by the synod and council, the 18-month trial begins, with a target start date at the beginning of Advent on November 30th. As part of the change, the weekly Sunday service will move to 11:00 am, with Sunday School starting at 9:45 am. Saturday services will continue as scheduled.
